THE DISTRICT

One of the highlights of the competitive year was the introduction of a complete set of trophies donated for the Junior Championships with titles as follows:

Two things are of note from the finals of this year's junior event. The first is the shift in power from the BCO to Rideau B.C. The second is the first appearance of Gordie Morgan in District Junior finals. Gord has been a true devotee to the sport and could be seen on court at the RA Centre and Masters competitions, well into the 21st century.

It might be noted here that during this period it was the practise of allowing the winners to keep the trophies for the year. This and problems of control through the dormant years of WW2 has lead to the loss of all of the District Junior Trophies except the Stewart trophy for Men's Singles.

In March five players from BCO were among a contingent of Canadians who travelled to Boston for the New England Badminton Championships. The Canadians took 7 of the 8 championship positions. Bev Mitchell took the Men's Singles and combined with Helen Grant of St. Catherines for the Mixed title. Isabel Bryson took the Ladies Singles while James Bryson combined with Walter Kramer of Detroit for the Men's Doubles. It was also announced that George Goodwin Jr. would be leaving for Camp Borden to take up duties

with the RCAF.

On the challenge cup scene, Rideua BC would again unsuccessfully challenge BCO for the Journal Cup losing the competition 10 matches to 5. In the (Cairine) Wilson Cup the Capital BC (Claire Parsons and Helen Watson) won out over teams from YWCA, St. George's and Garrison BCs. The Hodgson Cup (LS/LD) was won by the Montreal L.T.& B.C. over their BCO counterparts 11 matches to 8. BCO had successfully defended the cup honours the previous four years.

From the valley came news that the Renfrew Militia B.C. had successfully defended its' ownership of the Findley Cup for the fifth straight year. Renfrew competed against teams from Smiths Falls, Carleton Place. Pembroke, Almonte and Arnprior. This is an annual tournament, restricted to valley teams with the location rotating through the different clubs. While the number of clubs has declined, this competition is still being held annually at the time of this publication.

Smiths Falls and Renfrew Militia B.C.s joined the District family.
